The CCTST was established in October 2005 as a research resource and “academic home” for clinical and translational scientists and programs, that provides services to the Greater Cincinnati area.

The CCTST spearheaded the application for the Clinical and Translational Science Award (CTSA), which was funded in April 2009, wherein the University of Cincinnati and its institutional partners became the 39th member of the national CTSA Consortium.

Community Engagement

Community Leaders Institute (CLI)

CLI is a training program designed to enhance community research and capacity building competencies in community leaders. The overall goal of the program is to assist agencies that engage and empower communities to reduce health, social and educational disparities in leveraging funding and data analysis to improve services and programs.

\$62,000 in CLI grants through the CCTST have leveraged over **\$3 million** in funding

Community Health Grant (CHG)

The CCTST awards Community Health Grants to programs that focus on health promotion activities for children and/or adults in community settings such as clinics and schools. The CHG, up to \$20,000, can be given to one program or split among several programs depending on the quantity and quality of applications that are received.

A Collaborative Effort



The Pediatric Regional Collaborative Grant

promotes translational research collaborations between pediatric institutions in Cincinnati, Columbus, Cleveland, Indianapolis and Lexington, bringing together resources such as scientific expertise and patient populations that are not all readily available at a single site.



The Pilot and Innovation Research Program

a partnership between the University of Kentucky and UC/Cincinnati Children's, this program encourages the development of multi-institutional research teams capable of performing highly innovative, extramurally fundable research contributing to human health and well-being.



The Appalachian Translational Research Network

focuses on health disparities in the region, and includes the University of Kentucky, Marshall University, Ohio University, The Ohio State University, University of Pikeville (KY) and West Virginia University.
